Korean American Students Mobilize to Recall Gascon

The uniqueness of American political culture is its emphasis on active civic participation. For Korean American students in Los Angeles, this has manifested in various methods - such as working to collect signatures for the recall of District Attorney George Gascon. This summer, high school students from the Beverly Hills High School Speech and Debate Team led a collaborative effort to inform citizens of Los Angeles of current policies and collect signed petitions to contribute towards the recall movement.

When deciding where first to start the outreach, Koreatown was unanimously brought up as a suggestion and ultimately chosen. The reason is simple - District Attorney Gascon's policies significantly impact minority populations, In particular, the Asian American and Korean communities. As noted by the official Recall George Gascon movement website, the district attorney's policies are "soft on crime," with eliminations of cash bail and crimes such as criminal threats no longer being prosecuted in Los Angeles county. Furthermore, the DA's office now takes violent Hills and the BHHS Speech and criminals, such as those involved in murder, rape, and robbery, to be first-time offenders, and prohibits prosecutors from filing enhancements on such cases if the offender is on parole.

The students of the Beverly Hills High School, BHHS, Speech and Debate Team, along with those from the Asian American Association of Beverly Hills, aimed to first inform the Koreatown citizens about Gascon's policies and their impacts, then collect signatures to contribute to the recall movement.

"Initially, I was discouraged because so many people just walked by without even letting us a chance to speak," notes a high school student that participated in the initiative. "But as I began to speak out and directly discuss these policies in Korean, more people began to listen." Overall, students from the Asian American Association of Beverly Debate Teamagreed that the experience was both fulfilling and meaningful, although the initial cold reactionshadintimidated them.

Now, the results of the recall movement have been released: more than 717,000 signatures were submitted with the uniform hopes of recalling George Gascon. Ultimately, the recall movement did not collect enough signatures to get on the ballot, as 195,783 were deemed invalidbythe Registrar of Los Angeles County. Students from the Asian American Association of Beverly Hills note that the LA County Registrar has refused to verify the signatures that they have invalidated, and hope that this may change soon. Moving forward, students from the civic actions group in Beverly Hills will continue to mobilize to spread awareness of Gascon's devastatingly harmful policies, along with news about other injustices in our politicalsystem.

IFS Muay Thai Kickboxing Showdown

IFS, more commonly known as the International Fight Showdown, was hosted on Friday, September 30th, at Grand Theater in Anaheim. It was a fight showcase featuring many amazing fighters who were all aspiring Muay Thai or Kickboxing fighters, and who were looking to debut and make a name for themselves. There was one exception to this, a match to determine the champion, which was by far the coolest match in the entire showdown. As the fights consisted of a mateurs, no one really bled or showed fancy moves, which was the only difference between the championship match and normal fights. The IFS has more matches coming up, the IFS55CS taking place on January 14th, UFE 56 on March 25th, IFS 57 on May 27th, and even more, continuing until IFS 60 on November 18th, 2023.

nounces the last vote.

Inside the theater, there were around 400 seats in the audience section and a giant ring in the middle on an elevated platform, with a blue and a red corner. The contestants were extremely protected, as they had headgear, a mouth guard, boxing gloves, and feet and shin protectors. There was an award stagewherefirst, second, and thirdplace winners would stand. The trophy was placed beneath them so the winner could jump down to get it. When they did retrieve it, smoke was lit behind them, and a cool firework spark effect was shot up from behind their backs. On the left were the judge's seats, the announcers seat, and a trophy table holding around 40 trophies.

Anyone is allowed to become a qualified fighter as long as they train and work hard. Muay Thai and kickboxing are often confused, $as they are both {\it really similar forms}$ of martial arts. Both are seen using kicks and punches, but Muay Thai also includes elbows, knees, and the full body. These bring moves such as the clinch, elbow strikes, and knee strikes to the table. As I ob served the matches, I saw kickboxing more as boxing, while in Muay Thai, the competitors grabbed the other and either proceeded to knee or elbow them, very similar to wrestling. Overall this experience was a great one, and I suggest watching pro fighters, as you will gain a lot of excitement and have lots of fun!

After waiting for two years, DX Korea 2022 finally opened on September 21 to September 25 in Kintex. About 65,000 people from fifty countries and 350 companies joined this exhibition. The main theme of this expo was weapon systems, counter-terrorism and security equipment, combat support materials and equipment, UAM / weapon systems, Artificial intelligence (AI), defense and space

field, and information and communication security systems. There were exhibitions inside and outside of the Kintexbuilding.

The exhibition that was held inside showed lots of drones and artificial intelligence. Also, multiple presentations gave information about the products that the companies had made. There were numerous future weapons, such as autonomous-

The Purpose of Cornell Notes

The Cornell Note-Taking System has been around since the 1950s and, over the years, has proved that the system can be efficient and effective. The note-taking style was called 'Cornell' Notes after the university where it was produced, Cornell University, by professor Walter Pauk. The system is explained in his book, How to Study in College.

Cornell Notebook papers are usually divided into four sections. The first top section is meant for the title. The second section, which is the largest of the sections, is for the main notes, preferably taken before class. The third section, a side column on the very left of the notes, is used for cues such as in-class notes, keywords, questions, diagrams, concepts, comments, etc. The last section is at the bottom of the notes and is for a summary of the whole page. Ideally, the main notes should be written before class, and additional mentions should be scribbled on the side column. The summary

can either bewritten before or following the lecture. Then, the side column and the summary section are prepared to be viewed for future studying to reduce the study time. This way, Cornell Notes help you to think actively, causing students to operate critical thinking, summarize, question, and recall information.

Cornell Notes can be adjusted based on your proclivity, such as rearranging the space between sections, choosing which information to record, and customizing the side column with study guidecues of your option.

Although the Cornell System could be attempted on all subjects, the most worthwhile ones to note-take are Science and History/Geography due to the amount of information the subjects require to organize. English and or literature are other subjects that can be decent for the system. One subject that might be considered insufficient for the Cornell Systemismath, which wouldn't contain much critical thinking or summarizing.

Middle and High School Science Teacher Dr. Elena Son stated that she requires all her students to provide andutilize Cornell Notebooks for her classes, and stated, "Ido this because I want students to be exposed to a different type of note-taking, and it's a tool I'mproviding that can be utilized later, after graduation as well." Emily Son, a senior in high school, gave her opinions and tips about Cornell Notes, "Cornell Notes are effective, as they combine note-taking and studying together, because of the way the system works. Some say I waste so much time note-taking, but I get a lot of studying done while writing and organizing the notes."

There are biased opinions on the Cornell System, as the style has substantial advantages and disadvantages. Some advantages are that the notes are organized, provide easily-accessible study cues, and help you focus in class. Some disadvantages are that note-taking can be time-consuming, the result of both before-and-after-class notes might result in overfull notes, and aren't necessarilyideal for all subjects. The opinions and results can depend on your preferences for note-taking and studying. Yet, Cornell Notes could be worth trying out if you're looking for strategies on note-takingandstudying.

The official length of the marathon is 42.195 km, but most places have 5 km, 10 km, 21.0975 km (also known as the half marathon), and 42.195 km. The official length is 42.195km because, during the 4th London Olympics, they wanted Windsor Castle to be the starting point and gave the extra 0.195km to 42 km. The length has not changed since. The rules for a marathon are that you can not get

help from other people (even the medical team unless you resign), you can not leave the course, and there needs to be a feeding station every 5km.

The marathon was added to the Modern Olympics in 1896 for men. Eighty-nine years later, women also were able to compete in the 1984 Summer Olympics held in Los Angeles. The mMarathon gives chances to the disabled by having a wheelchair division, where you use a wheelchair to participate in the race. The world record for a marathon is 2 hours 1 minute and 09 seconds for men, 2 hours 14 minutes and 4 seconds for women, 1 hour 18 minutes 27 seconds for men wheelchair division, 1 hour 34 minutes and 22 seconds for the women's wheelchair divi-
