Korea's Climate Crisis

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Everyone has heard of climate change, or as most people call it, global warming. Everyone also knows that it's a big deal. For those who are still unfamiliar with the situation, global warming is a crisis felt throughout the world. It is caused by the excess use of greenhouse gasses such as carbon dioxide and methane emitted by factories, and gas vehicles, heating the earth to extreme levels. It is causing devastating weather changes such as heat, drought, and an increase in hurricanes. One country in particular has recently felt a hint of what Mother Nature is capable of, due to climate change.

In July, South Korea was already drenched due to being in the middle of a great typhoon season. For days, Korea experienced "torrential rain," ultimately causing extreme, widespread floods, overflowing dams, and landslides. It was so bad it even forced the government to urge its people to "refrain from going outside." But on

a fateful day, many people's lives faced grave danger.

Saturday, July 15, in the central region of Cheongju, South Korea, south of Seoul, river dams lining the Miho River proved to be unsuccessful against the sudden downpour of rain and the overflooding of the river. Water began to flood nearly the entire city at an alarming rate, and with no warning at all, an underpass near the center of the city, just 600 meters away from the river, began flooding, trapping nearly 15 vehicles as well as a bus. The death toll rose to

more than 40 people, with 34 others injured. More than 10,000 have had to evacuate due to extreme weather hazards and flooding literally coming up to their doorsteps. 200 homes and 150 roads were swept away and destroyed due to hazardous downpours and brisk floods.

Nearly 400 rescue operators were needed to save and recover as many lives and bodies as possible. During that process, the South Korean fire department was still taking action by pumping out the muddy water even though six days had passed.

Survivors say they had barely any time to know what was happening before the water reached all the way up to the roof of the underpass. Many people blame the government's lack of preparation. They are upset that they weren't able to close off the bridge in time, even though they knew that the levees were not able to withstand such floods.

But Cheongju was not the only city affected by this disastrous climate crisis. Reports have shown thathalfwaythroughthemonsoon season, enough rain had already been unleashed to surpass the usual amount of precipitation in monsoon seasons years before. Nearly everywhere in S. Korea has severely been affected by these torrential rains, leading to thousands being forced to evacuate, and many farming villages being destroyed. So who can deny the fact that climate change has surely already taken over the world? We must work together to lessen the deadly impact of this global crisis.

Coffee grounds also improve the soil structure of a

garden. They aerate the soil by forming air pockets, which stimulate plant growth. Additionally, coffee grounds are also great natural pest repellents, protecting plants and important insects in the garden. Furthermore, coffee grounds are known to attract earthworms, which are really important in a healthy gar-

den, because they break down organic matter, improve soil texture, and provide nutrients to garden plants.
